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

#### **CULTIVATING TRUST**

- Learn to connect
  - Find a common interest.
- Don't tokenize
  - Be welcoming when inviting a family to an event.
- Be patient
  - It may take a bit for a family to allow for open dialogue.
- Learn about the culture
  - Being culturally aware and responsive.

#### **ACCESS TO INFORMATION**

- Language access
  - Beyond translation services
- Diagnosis/Identification for DHH children and DHH+
  - Handouts and next steps
  - Cultural Brokers
  - Benefits of collaboration

#### UNDERSTANDING LEGAL RIGHTS

- Families have rights
- Allowed to advocate
- Providers can help:
  - Share information and find resources
  - Freedom of choice
  - Scarcity mindset
