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

#### What is an IFSP?



A written plan with goals, supports, and services for an eligible child and their family.

Developed by a team of experts, including the family!

Family centered- matches the priorities and routines of the family.

An IFSP is the promise of a partnership.

#### **Evaluation & Quality IFSP Goals**



Overall Purpose of Part C:


Who's on the evaluation team?

Initial IFSP Goals: based on evaluation data with input from parents' priorities with their consent

When is the plan updated?

Requirement: Re-evaluate before the 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday (*JCIH recommends 6* month intervals ending just before the 3<sup>rd</sup> birthday)
